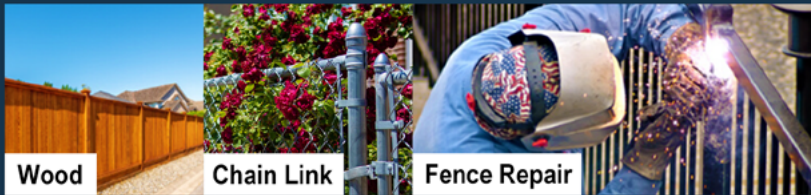

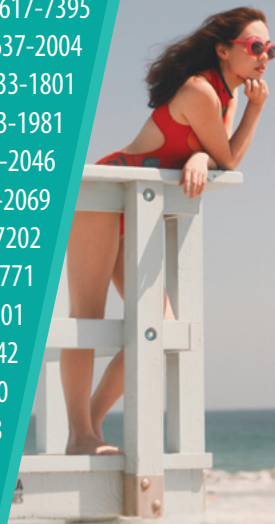

Brevard County History



Located in the state of Florida, Brevard County has its official county seat in Titusville. In 1989, a secondary administrative hub featuring a circuit courthouse was established in Viera, a planned community that lies at the geographic center of the county.

Prior to the 16th century and the settlement of non-indigenous people, this area was home to Native Americans. The Windover Archeological Site, found within the county, holds evidence of human habitation stretching back more than 7,000 years. Founded in 1855, Brevard County honors the memory of Theodore Washington Brevard, a pioneer settler and state comptroller of Florida. Over the years, the county's boundaries have been modified and diminished several times, with the current limits being set in 1907.

Referred to as the Space Coast, Brevard County owes its nickname to the impact of the John F. Kennedy Space Center and the aerospace sector on its local economy. According to the 2020 census, the population was recorded at 606,612, ranking it as the 10th most populous county in Florida.

CAPE CANAVERAL

In 1848, the construction of a lighthouse prompted several families to settle in the vicinity, leading to the formation of a small yet stable community. With the decreasing likelihood of Seminole Indian assaults, additional settlers moved to the region surrounding the Indian River. Canaveral, Canaveral Harbor, and Artesia saw the establishment of post offices and small stores with postal services. In 1890, a group of Harvard University alumni founded a hunting club named the Canaveral Harvard Club, encompassing more than 18,000 acres. Their hunting activities facilitated the clearing of wilderness areas for new settlers. In the early 1920s, Orlando-based journalists invested over \$150,000 in beach properties, which now contain streets named after presidents in Cape Canaveral. They named their development Journalista (currently Avon-by-the-Sea) in tribute to their profession. The city of Cape Canaveral officially began in 1961 when a committee was formed for incorporation. However, due to delays in paperwork, the city charter was passed as bill 167 and received approval from the Florida State Legislature in Tallahassee on May 16, 1963. According to the 2020 US census, the population was recorded at 9,912.

MELBOURNE

Brevard County, Florida is home to Melbourne, a city situated 72 miles southeast of Orlando and 175 miles northwest of Miami. In terms of both area and number of residents, it stands as the second-largest municipality in the county. The initial group of settlers arrived post-1877, which included notable figures such as Richard W. Goode, his father John Goode, Cornthwaite John Hector, Captain Peter Wright, Balaam Allen, the Wright Brothers, and Thomas Mason. Among these men, Wright, Allen, and the Brothers were recognized as black freedmen. Originally known as "Crane Creek," the city's name was changed to Melbourne to honor Cornthwaite John Hector, its first postmaster, who was an Englishman and had lived extensively in Melbourne, Victoria, Australia. In the late 1890s, the Brownlie-Maxwell Funeral Home was established and continues to operate today. The county's oldest black-owned business, Tucker's Cut-Rate plumbing, opened its doors in 1934. During the early 20th century, many houses were constructed in a frame vernacular style. A significant fire in 1919 devastated most of the original downtown area along Front Street, leading to its reconstruction west of US Hwy 1. In 1969, the cities of Eau Gallie and Melbourne voted to merge, creating the contemporary city of Melbourne. According to the 2020 Census, its population was recorded at 84,678.

MERRITT ISLAND

Merritt Island, is a peninsula situated in Brevard County, Florida, along the Atlantic Ocean on the state's eastern coast. The name Merritt Island pays homage to a land grant bestowed by the King of Spain to a nobleman with the same surname. In 1837, Fort Ann was established on the island's eastern shore, close to what is now known as Haulover Canal, for the purpose of safeguarding the region from Seminole attacks. The more recent history of Merritt Island, which began in the mid-19th century, primarily revolves around the flourishing citrus industry, with a focus on the cultivation of oranges and pineapples. This sandy locale is renowned for its Indian River oranges and grapefruit. However, the local pineapple business suffered greatly from freezes in the late 1890s. Following the Civil War, freed slaves formed small communities such as Haulover, Clifton, and Shiloh in the region. The island experienced significant population growth during the 1950s and 1960s, coinciding with the onset of the Space Race and the expansion of nearby NASA facilities. According to the 2020 census, the population stood at 34,518.

PALM BAY

Palm Bay, situated in Brevard County, Florida, originally appeared on late 1700s maps under various names including Turkey Creek, Elbow Creek, and Crane Creek. An 1870 map created by John Andrew Bostrom depicted the region as largely uninhabited within a 15-mile radius of Turkey Creek. The first significant European-American settler in this area was John Tillman, who arrived in the late 1870s. Tillman's wharf, located at the mouth of Turkey Creek, became the foundation for what would later be recognized as Palm Bay along the Indian River. By the end of the 1880s, he had established a thriving grove of oranges and bananas on the northern banks of the creek, with his banana grove being particularly renowned throughout the Indian River. His wharf also served as a steamboat stop, thereby attracting more settlers. Between 1910 and 1914, the Indian River Catholic Colony, a land company, took root in Tillman. However, farmers' attempts to cultivate two annual crops led to quick soil depletion and ultimately the colony's demise. Survivors of this colony went on to construct St. Joseph's Church on Miller Street, which remains the oldest structure still in existence. In the 1920s, the area was officially named Palm Bay, taking inspiration from the bay lined with sabal palm trees near the mouth of Turkey Creek. According to the 2020 census, the city boasted a population of 119,760.

PORT ST. JOHN

Port St. John is a designated census area situated between Cocoa and Titusville in Brevard County. In 2002, a collective of five residents established "Port St. John For Tomorrow" (PSJ4T) with the aim of incorporating the Port St. John region. The incorporation proposal put forth by PSJ4T encompassed five distinct communities: Hardeeville, Williams Point, Delespine, Frontenac, and a section of Sharpes. However, the five committees in Tallahassee deemed the study "seriously flawed." Consequently, county officials permitted the residents of Port St. John and the five communities to vote on the proposal to become a city, which ultimately failed in November 2002. According to the 2020 census, the population stood at 23,474.

ROCKLEDGE

Situated in Brevard County, Florida, Rockledge holds the distinction of being the oldest city in the region, having been officially established on August 7, 1887. This makes it the first incorporated municipality within Brevard County. The name "Rockledge" has its origins with Gardner S. Hardee, an early settler, and is derived from the numerous ledges of coquina rock lining the Indian River. Additionally, some accounts attribute the name to Cephas Bailey Magruder, who built his residence near the Indian River in 1876 and referred to it as "the rockledge home." Ultimately, this name came to signify the entire town. Initially spelled as "Rock Ledge," the two-word designation remained in use throughout the 19th century. The local economy primarily revolved around the citrus industry and hospitality services for tourists heading to South Florida via the Indian River's Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway. According to the 2020 Census, the city's population stands at 27,678.

TITUSVILLE

Titusville serves as the county seat of Brevard County in Florida. For thousands of years, this region was home to Indigenous peoples, evidenced by the discovery of the Windover Archeological Site in 1982, which dates back to the early Archaic Period (6000 to 5000 BC). Due to the importance of these remnants, it has been designated a National Historic Landmark. At the time European explorers arrived, the Ais Indians resided in the area, gathering fruits such as palmetto, cocoplum, and seagrape berries, as well as fishing in the Indian River, referred to as the Rio de Ais by the Spanish. However, by 1760, the tribe had vanished, largely due to the impact of diseases, slave raids, and the influence of rum. Florida became part of the United States in 1821, but the Seminole Wars hindered the settlement of some regions within this new territory. Initially known as Sand Point, the community saw the establishment of a post office in 1859, though it ceased operations shortly thereafter. In 1867, Henry T. Titus arrived with plans to develop a town on land belonging to his wife, Mary Hopkins Titus, the daughter of a notable planter from Darien, Georgia. He constructed roads and in 1870 built the Titus House, a sizable one-story hotel adjacent to a saloon. Additionally, he donated land for four churches and a courthouse to facilitate the town's recognition as the county seat. Local lore suggests that to determine the town's name, Titus played a game of dominoes against Capt. Clark Rice, ultimately winning and prompting Sand Point to be renamed Titusville in 1873. The city achieved incorporation in 1887, coinciding with the commencement of construction on St. Gabriel's Episcopal Church, which is recognized in the 1972 National Register of Historic Places. At one time, Titusville earned the moniker "The City of Churches." According to the 2020 census, the city's population stood at 48,789.

WEST MELBOURNE

Located in Brevard County, Florida, West Melbourne was established in 1959 by voters aiming to prevent the area from being incorporated into the City of Melbourne. The city has seen the most significant percentage of population growth among all municipalities in Brevard County since the year 2000. In 2005, West Melbourne implemented property taxes for the first time since its inception. According to the 2020 US Census, the population stood at 25,924.

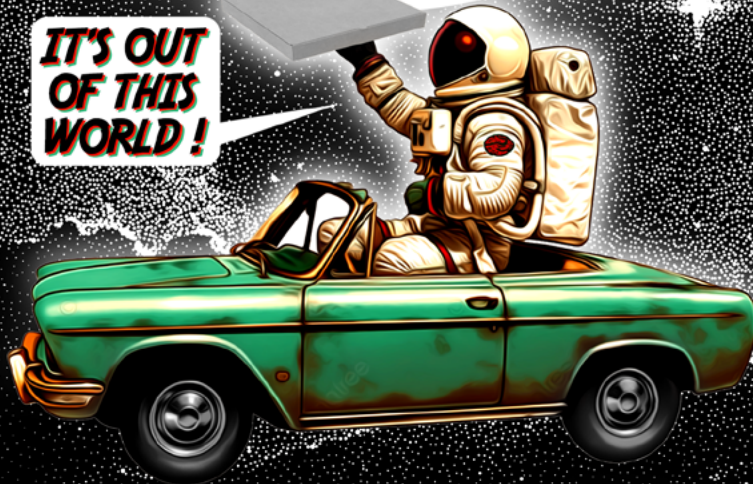

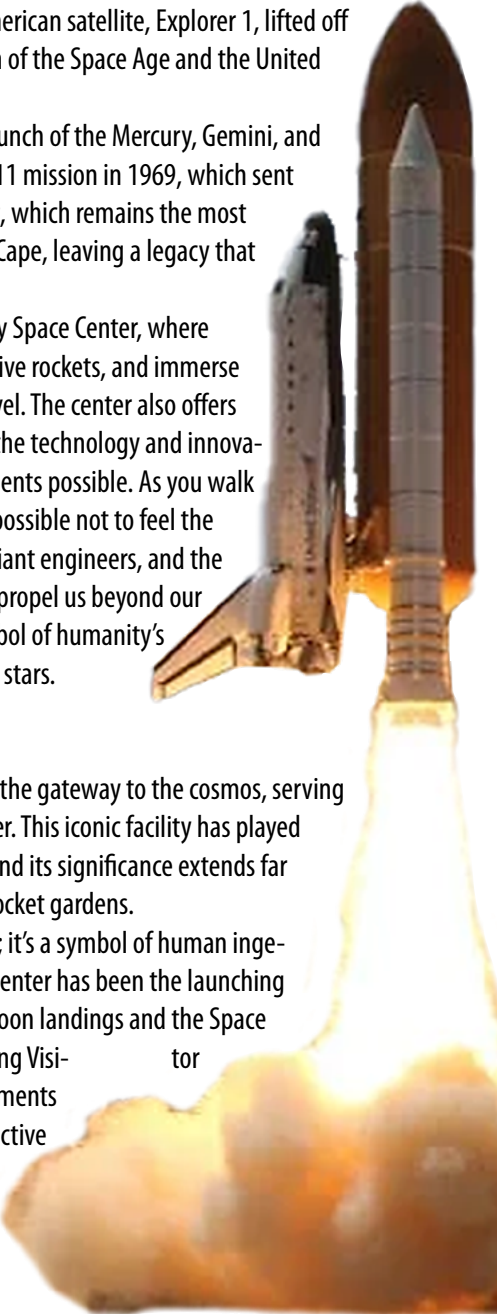

Purple Flag: This flag is used to indicate the presence of dangerous marine life, such as sharks or jellyfish. It is advised to exercise caution.

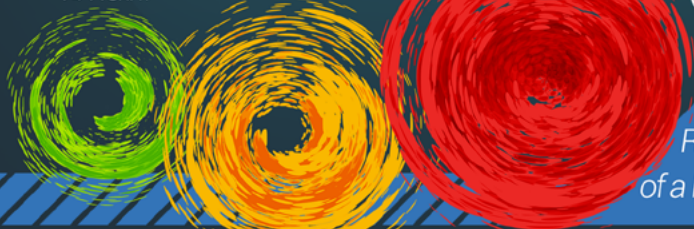
